

MARION LAKE CAMP

Welcome to the Marion Lake Camp.

There are three campsites in the camping area. Please place your tents on the tent pads at these sites. You can help prevent these campsites from spreading (expanding in size) with time and use by staying on trails and off vegetation when possible. In early season when sites are still covered with snow or wet it is better to camp on snow than on the fragile emerging vegetation. Campsite improvements such as ditching around tents and constructing rock walls are prohibited. There has been considerable revegetation and trail closure work in this area. Please use the established trail system.

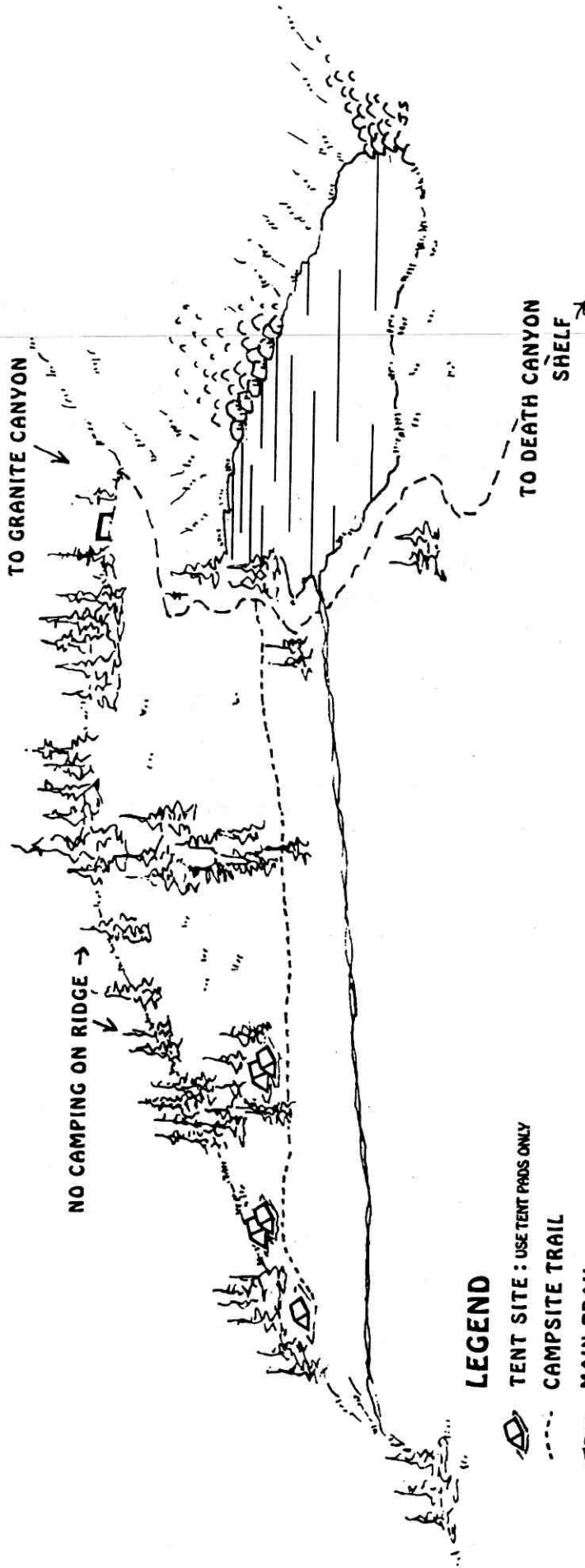
This area is frequented by bears and other wild animals. Protect your possessions, yourselves and these animals by properly storing your food. There is a bear box near the center site. Make sure to store your food there when not cooking or eating.

You are reminded that campfires are prohibited. Carry out all trash (do not burn).






Backcountry toilets are not provided at this camp. Bury feces in shallow holes (4-6 inches) in soil at least 200 feet from camps, streams or water sources.

HISTORICALLY, MARION LAKE HAS BEEN AN AREA OF HEAVY USE AND DEGRADING IMPACTS. EXTENSIVE RE-VEGETATION NEAR THE LAKESHORE, ON OLD UNNECESSARY TRAILS AND CAMPSITES HAS BEEN COMPLETED IN RECENT YEARS. REDUCE YOUR IMPACTS BY USING THE TENT PADS AT THE SITES AND STAYING OFF RESTORED VEGETATION.
